Public Utilities: Dave Ubel reports one of high service pumps at the water plant is leaking. A quote from Magney, the contractor that did the plant upgrade work, is \$3500 to fix. Dave has conferred with engineers on the design and will be getting additional quotes.

Council Reports: Bode reports double doors on east side of Community Center are in need of repair. This would be a decision for Community Center Board. Bode as representative from Council should confer with Courtland Township representative to determine action needed.

Planning Commission: Commissioners continued discussion on comprehensive plan update and discussion on zoning ordinance for cannabis businesses.

City Clerk: Holm reports office will be closed for President's Day Monday February 17. Holm will be attending Clerk's Conference March 18-21, 2025. Holm will be monitoring emails and voicemails while gone.

John Stadick is present for additional discussion of storm water drainage issue on Wishbone Way that has been previously discussed. After much discussion of costs and who will pay. Rodewald brought up the need to create stormwater fund with at fee collected on utility bill. Poehler asks if the fund would be under general or utilities and if it is possible to assess on taxes. Mayor Poehler made a motion to move forward with ditch maintenance city paid. Discussion on how decision will affect future and other areas that may need maintenance as well. Rodewald votes to issue right of way permit to homeowners to clean ditch to grade, bottom of culvert to culvert. Council is in agreement.

John Stadick representing Courtland Fireman Relief Association is present to request raise in firefighter benefit from \$1900 to \$2100. The fund balance is currently 116% vested. The increase will reduce vested amount to 108%, guidelines allow for funds to be at a vested percentage of 95%. The Relief board makes the decisions on how the funds are invested and have been successful in the fund doing very well. The benefit is for fireman that retire from service and is paid out based on years of service. Must have 10 or more years to receive and after 20 years receive 100% of benefit, they must also reach an age of 59 before benefit can be paid out. Council is agreeable to increasing the benefit at this time. Kraus made a motion to approve Fireman Relief benefit raise of \$200 to \$2100. Rodewald seconded the motion. Motion carried with all in favor.

Clerk Holm presents Ordinance 25-101 Electric Franchise Ordinance. The ordinance is an update to previous with Xcel Energy that is expiring. Holm was contacted by Xcel with the updated draft ordinance and after seeking comments from council, has made changes to that draft in order to present at this meeting.

Rodewald made a motion to approve Ordinance 25-101 Electric Franchise Ordinance waiving the reading. Marti seconded the motion waiving the reading. Motion carried with all in favor.

Holm presents draft ordinance pertaining to Cannabis and Hemp Businesses relating to zoning. Holm received an email from a company inquiring what our zoning is in regard to these businesses. Holm has had additional discussion with Lafayette and Nicollet clerks as they received this email as well. Nicollet is preparing to pass ordinance presented and will have Nicollet County be in control of licensing and compliance same as tobacco licensing. Lafayette is also going with this option. Councilmember Marti would like to see city have the control of licensing to keep that revenue. Holm will prepare draft ordinance and have planning commission look them over and send back to council next month.

Dave Ubel brings up discussion on stormwater drainage on Stony Point and council considering city paying the expense to correct issues. Clerk to put on next month agenda for discussion.

Mayor Report: Mayor Poehler has been approached again on development north of new highway. Poehler asks council thoughts city participation in cost of infrastructure. Poehler would like to have Bolton and Menk prepare a feasibility study on how to bring water to north side of the highway but only in general terms to get approximate costs.

Poehler asks council to review Joint Powers agreement with Rural Fire Association to keep moving forward. The agreement has been in works for two years the main discussion has been valuations of property coming into the agreement.

## Kraus made a motion to adjourn. Rodewald seconded the motion. Motion carried with all in favor.
